Junior Christian Danyo is a promising left-handed bat at third base and senior Jordan Hoefling assumed the catching duties while hitting in the middle of the order. Those two, along with Dave Lewis at the top of the order, give the Raiders lineup a good start and if the senior-heavy pitching staff can take a step forward, Toms River East should be back in the postseason, where the Raiders are always dangerous.

## 6. Southern



The individual standout of the 22nd Skyland Conference Championships yesterday at David Noonan Field in Hillsborough was an unlikely female from Hunterdon County who has only begun to embrace her vast ability.

North Hunterdon sophomore Morgan Harvey, who ate a four-leaf clover for good luck before the meet began, stole the show yesterday as the only athlete, male or female, to earn three individual gold medals. She won the 400-meter hurdles in a personal-best 1:02.54 (No. 6 in New Jersey this season), the open 400 in 58.95 and the 200 in a personal-best 25.54.

The depth of the boys and girls pole vault competitions were astounding. Four girls were still alive when the bar was raised to 12-0. Only Hillsborough sophomore Marlena Sabatino and Miami-bound senior Erin Knabe of Voorhees cleared that height, and Sabatino cleared 12-6 on her second attempt to nail down a personal best and break the meet record by four inches.

Connor Grunwald, a senior headed for Connecticut, was one of seven boys still alive with the bar at 14-0. He was the only competitor to clear 14-6, matching his personal best, but he was clearly frustrated with not clearing 14-8 with the meet record at 14-7.





Their teams are not having the type of success that heavyweights at places like Toms River South, Jackson Memorial and Red Bank Catholic have had this season, but several players around the Shore Conference are quietly putting together huge years under the radar.

Two of the biggest examples are Point Boro junior catcher Ryan Prout and Southern senior outfielder Jack Bush, who have been consistently productive for two teams that have been under .500 for much of the season while playing competitive schedules.

Prout may be better known as a quarterback-chasing linebacker on the football team, but he is putting

together a monster season at the plate for a team that is fighting to reach .500 by the cutoff for the Shore Conference Tournament on May 14. Through May 4, Prout was hitting .449 with 22 hits, a Shore Conference-high 11 doubles, and 14 RBIs for the Panthers, ranking in the top 10 in several categories. Even in losses against top pitchers, Prout is usually the one doing damage for Point Boro.

Bush has been the same way, as his 10 doubles were one behind Prout among the leaders. He already has the Southern career record for doubles, and he could possibly wind up with the school record for highest career average. At .525, he

was fourth in the Shore among the batting leaders through May 4, and that's playing in Class A South, one of the most competitive divisions in the state. His finest moment came in an upset of third-seeded Manchester in the Ocean County Tournament on May 5, as he belted a three-run homer in the first inning

the 11th inning to help the Rams make a surprising move to the quarterfinals.

Freehold

senior shortstop Matt Holtz has also exploded in the first month for a below-.500 team, as he was hitting .489 with a Shore Conference-high 24 hits, 10 doubles, 12 stolen bases and 19 runs scored, the last of which ranked second in the Shore. Like Prout, Red Bank Regional junior catcher Dillon Stambaugh is better known as a tackling machine at linebacker for the Bucs, but he has proven to be a star on the

diamond as well. With a .470 average, 24 hits, and 14 RBIs, he was right among the top 10 in several categories.


The surprises have not been limited to offensive players either, as pitchers like Brick Memorial's Brian Cottrell and Neptune's Tyler Daly have been impressive after entering the season under the radar.
