


Pinelands vs. Southern

Roger Maxwell "Doc" Cramer was born on July 22, 1905, in Beach Haven and moved to Manahawkin as a young child. He attended the Manahawkin elementary school and Barnegat High School, where he played shortstop on the high school baseball team. After graduation, he worked as a carpenter while playing in the semi-professional baseball league in Beach Haven. It was there he was discovered by Jimmy Dykes and former Philadelphia Athletics catcher Ralph "Cy" Perkins, who asked him to try out for the Athletics. Connie Mack signed him to a \$3,500 professional contract, and he was assigned to Martinsburg, WV, for the 1929 season where he hit .404. He began to see more time on the big league level in late 1929, and played 94 games in the 1932 season while compiling a .336 batting average and a .396 batting avg. in 154 games in 1933. On June 10, 1932, Cramer went 6-for-6 at the plate; he later tied the major league record by going 6-for-6 again on July 13, 1935. He also hit for the cycle on June 10, 1934. He spent a few seasons in Boston beginning in 1936 and then moved to Washington for a year in 1941 before finding a seven-year home on

the Detroit Tigers. He is credited for playing a major role in the Tigers' 1944 pennant chase and was described by H. Salinger as "the best fielding center fielder in the league this year." 1948 was Cramer's last major league season; afterwards, he managed the Buffalo Bisons and Seattle Rainiers for two seasons apiece before retiring back to his hometown. He took up carpentry again, as well as duck hunting. Doc Cramer passed away on Sept. 9, 1990. His legend still lives on through his family as well as in town; anyone who lives in this area surely knows Doc Cramer Boulevard and the impressive Doc Cramer Sports Complex. More importantly than his stats or whatever is named after him, however, was his pure love of the game.

# Stumpy's Corner

*Their teams are not having the type of success that heavyweights at places like Toms River South, Jackson Memorial and Red Bank Catholic have had this season, but several players around the Shore Conference are quietly putting together huge years under the radar.*

Two of the biggest examples are Point Boro junior catcher Ryan Prout and Southern senior outfielder Jack Bush, who have been consistently productive for two teams that have been under .500 for much of the season while playing competitive schedules.

Prout may be better known as a quarterback-chasing linebacker on the football team, but he is putting together a monster season at the plate for a team that is fighting to reach .500 by the cutoff for the Shore Conference Tournament on May 14. Through May 4, Prout was hitting .449 with 22 hits, a Shore Conference-high 11 doubles, and 14 RBIs for the Panthers, ranking in the top 10 in several categories. Even in losses against top pitchers, Prout is usually the one doing damage for Point Boro.

Bush has been the same way, as his 10 doubles were one behind Prout among the leaders. He already has the Southern career record for doubles, and he could possibly wind up with the school record for highest career average. At .525, he was fourth in the Shore among the batting leaders through May 4, and that's playing in Class A South, one of the most competitive divisions in the state. His finest moment came in an upset of third-seeded Manchester in the Ocean County Tournament on May 5, as he belted a three-run homer in the first inning

the 11th inning to help the Rams make a surprising move to the quarterfinals.

Freehold senior shortstop Matt Holtz has also exploded in the first month for a below-.500 team, as he was hitting .489 with a Shore Conference-high 24 hits, 10 doubles, 12 stolen bases and 19 runs scored, the last of which ranked second in the Shore. Like Prout, Red Bank Regional junior catcher Dillon Stambaugh is better known as a tackling machine at linebacker for the Bucs, but he has proven to be a star on the diamond as well. With a .470 average, 24 hits, and 14 RBIs, he was right among the top 10 in several categories.
